

## NOMINATION OF STUDENTS FOR UGA PARTNERSHIPS

Some of you may have an agreement with one of our faculties, procedure and deadlines could be slightly different.

Within the framework of your agreement with the UGA, your students have the possibility to choose their courses among a varied offer.

Here are the steps to nominate your students to UGA:

#### 1. IDENTIFY THE UGA HOST FACULTY

The students will have to follow the majority of their courses in a host faculty. To help you to identify the faculty you can consult disciplines and teaching levels of all faculties and the course catalogue.

At the time of the application, the students will have to fill in a learning agreement according to the rules defines in by our faculties.

#### 2. STUDENT'S NOMINATIONS

The nomination are online. The portal will be open for 2018/2019 nominations on March 15, 2018.

#### Only nominated students through the portal will be accepted. If you have already informed us about your nominated students, we kindly ask you to nominate them through the form.

As soon as the opening of the form, you will be able to follow these steps:

- a) Sign in to our online nomination portal https://international-nominations.univ-grenoble-alpes.fr
  - b) Fill in the home university information
  - c) Fill in the nomination form as many times as necessary
- You will be able to modify your nominations until the deadlines mentioned below

#### Nominations deadlines:

- April 30th, 2018: mobility for the 1st semester and full year
- September 30th, 2018: mobility for the 2nd semester

Beware: We do not accept nominations sent after the deadline.

#### 3. APPLICATION PROCESS

The host faculty will send directly to the nominated student the application procedure.

The required documents are:

- all academic transcript of records
- curriculum vitae •
- any language test or a certificate on the ability to take courses on the language of instruction
- certificate of motivation
- learning agreement signed by the student and the sending university

#### 4. DECISION

The host faculty will send the notification of the decision Mid-June at the latest.

# HOUSING

#### Student housing

 In residence hall of the CROUS: from 150 to 430 € / month excluding charges

 9m<sup>2</sup>room: Shared washrooms /Bed, desk, wardrobe/closet, shelves, chair, washbasin, shared kitchen):
 From €160 to €180/ month

- 12-20m<sup>2</sup> room: *private shower, toilet* and washbasin/Bed, desk, wardrobe/closet, shelves, shelves, chair / Privatekitchenette): From €360/month

- Studio : From €430/month

• In private student residence: Students may elect to live in private housing; costs in Grenoble range from 250 to 840 € / month.

- Rental of a studio (private rental park): about from350 € +/ month
- Room in a shared flat: about 400 €
- Renting a room with the inhabitant (private rental park): about 280 € / month

Students do not have to contact directly the student housing department, They will receive an automatic email of the process to apply for housing.

#### Be careful: to respect the procedure that will be sent and check spams

Exchange students who complete the housing application process by the deadlines indicated are guaranteed a proposal of place in housing for students. They won't be asked for a French guarantor.

**Note:** If the student will be lodged in a residence CROUS, the arrival to the residence must be scheduled until the 8th day of the month.

Students who apply after the housing deadline may still be able to live in university housing if places are still available.

### **IMMIGRATION REQUIREMENTS**

Visas And Residence Permits

Depending on your nationality, you are exempted from obtaining a visa to enter metropolitan France and the <u>Schengen area</u>. Students residing outside the Schengen area should apply for a visa as soon as possible. Admitted students should begin the visa process as soon as possible. The letter will be sent by the international relations office of the host faculty. For more information: <u>visa and residence permits</u>

HEALTH INSURANCE • Residents of European Economic Community (EEC): the European health insurance card valid during the entire period of their mobility • Quebec residents: the form RAMQ N°SE 401Q106. • If you are not concerned by the two previous situations, you will have to suscribe to the French student insurance at the time of the registration and pay about 217€ (2017-18). Please refer to the practical sheet Social Security in France. Exceptions: - Students staying less than 90 days are not considered residents, and do not Health Insurance need to enroll. - Students 28 years of age or older cannot enroll in the sécurité sociale. Students in these cases may be able to enroll in the French national health care system should they so desire. Such students should speak with a university staff member when they arrive. Please note: emergency medical evacuation is not covered by the sécurité sociale. Students are strongly encouraged to verify that their home insurance covers this eventuality. The UGA's Health Center can respond to most student health care needs on campus.
